We are delighted to inform you that the Careers Convention for this academic year will take place on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March from 6-9.30pm. The event, aimed at all pupils and their parents in Year 9 and above, will offer careers sessions for pupils and parents as well as parental workshops covering a wide range of issues.

This year we are able to offer careers talks covering over seventy different professions, with the majority of these guest speakers coming from our parental and Old Cats network. We are very grateful to all these volunteers for supporting our pupils in this way and giving up their time and effort to help their career research.

The evening will be divided into six twenty-five minute sessions. Parental sessions will take place in the Humphreys Hall and careers talks in a variety of classrooms throughout the school. Refreshments will be located in the Refectory.

Obviously with over five hundred people attending the evening, we need to be able to manage group sizes, as the classrooms have limited space. We would therefore like to ask all students and parents to indicate the sessions that they would like to attend, in order that we may prepare a schedule for the evening. Some talks will be more popular than other so places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis so please return your reply slip as soon as possible.

The remainder of this booklet details the careers and professions being covered together with a brief job explanation to aid in choosing the sessions.

### **1. Speech and Language Therapy:**

Speech and language therapists are specialists in communication disorders. They assess, diagnose and treat people with speech, language and communication problems. The aim of speech and language therapy is to help people communicate to the best of their ability.

### **2. Psychology:**

Clinical Psychology: opportunities for enhancing well-being  
Clinical Psychologists work in a variety of settings (NHS, social service, education, voluntary sector etc). They use and develop evidence based psychological techniques to enhance health and wellbeing with individuals, services and communities."

### **3. Careers in the City:**

Looking at a broad range of City based careers with an emphasis on the banking world. What are the different career areas available and where will the future take you?

### **4. TV Executive:**

"Dan Allen is the Chief Operating Officer of FremantleMedia Enterprises (FME), the commercial arm of global TV business FremantleMedia. FME is responsible for the commercial exploitation of TV and other entertainment brands sourced from its own TV production operations (in 25 countries) and from third party producers and rights owners. Among FME's well-known TV brands are X-Factor, Britain's Got Talent, Pop Idol, Merlin, Neighbours, The Bill, Price is Right, Family Feud, QI, Never Mind the Buzzcocks, IT Crowd, The Apprentice and many more.

### **5. Marketing, PR and Web Design in a Digital World:**

Careers in a PR and marketing agency based in the City of London, focusing on Digital aspects of marketing i.e. search engine optimization, social media, web design etc.

### **6. PR and Business Development with Degree in Biochemistry!!**

Want to know what to do with a Biochemistry degree? Here's an idea, move into public relations and business development on a grand scale!

### **7. Take a Risk!**

What do a science degree, George Galloway, the Moscow Times, David Gold and taking a risk have in common? No idea, then come along to this talk and be inspired! If you want to know how being in the right place at the right time and being prepared to stick your neck out then this very unconventional career path might just be for you!

### **8. Fire-Fighter:**

Looking at the training required and the roles available within the fire service.

### **9. Publishing:**

Publishing professionals are responsible for the style, content and commercial success of publications and websites. Opportunities include editorial, design, marketing and business development. Publishers work in a number of areas, including the government, newspapers and magazines, book publishing, online publishing, TV and radio.

### **10. Computer and IT Consultant:**

Looking at the many different aspects of working in the IT industry including integration and development of systems, training and support as well as many others.

### **11. Careers in the Film Industry:**

What does a scriptwriter do and how do you get into TV, Film and Journalism?

### **12. Setting Up and Running Your Own Business:**

An ideal opportunity for all those budding entrepreneurs to hear about running your own company. Looking at the do's and don'ts of setting up a new company, how to become profitable as quickly as possible, deciding on a business strategy and marketing and sales.

### **13. Public Relations:**

The role of a public relations (PR) account executive is to plan, create and deliver publicity for clients that will establish and maintain goodwill and understanding between an organisation and its public. This is commonly achieved by proactive and close liaison with the media, including TV, radio, new media and the press.

### **14. Architecture:**

Architects design buildings and the spaces in and around them. They also help with the restoration and re-use of old or existing buildings.

### **15. Actuary:**

Actuaries make financial sense of the future. When a financial expert wants financial advice, they go to an actuary. Actuaries work in life insurance, pensions, general insurance, banking, fund management, social security and healthcare. Actuaries are experts in a field renowned for its complexity and mathematical prowess, applying techniques to solve real business problems involving analysis of future financial events, when the amount or timing of payments is uncertain. They are problem solvers and strategic thinkers with a deep understanding of financial systems. Working in an ever-changing environment, an actuarial career is one of the most diverse, exciting and rewarding in the world (see <http://www.careercast.com/jobs/content/ten-best-jobs-2010-jobs-rated>).

### **16. How to Produce that Perfect CV!**

Workshop on how to produce a CV for job applications. This could be for part time/weekend work or for jobs and careers. Learn the skills needed to be better than all the rest.

**17. Chartered Surveyor:**

The phrase Chartered Surveyor covers a variety of roles all embracing working as an agent for a client. This can involve:

Acquiring freehold or leasehold commercial space for an occupier client

Selling/disposing of commercial space for an occupier client or Property Company or Institutional Fund

Rent reviews for the landlord or the tenant

Development and investment advice i.e. buying land for commercial development or buying investments for the return and asset management opportunities.

**18. Tax and Accountancy:**

Francesca Lagerberg is Head of Tax at chartered accountants, Grant Thornton UK LLP where she specialises in a range of tax issues and runs the in-house technical department. Francesca joined Grant Thornton in 2006 and previously worked for another accountancy firm and ran her own practice. She is a past Chairman of the Tax Faculty of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW). With over 18 years experience in tax, Francesca has become a well-known commentator on tax issues in the national and professional press, and makes occasional TV appearances. She also lectures all over the UK on topical tax matters. Her qualifications include FCA, CTA (Fellow), Qualified Barrister and LLB (Hons)

**19. Dentist:**

Dentists diagnose and treat a range of problems that affect the mouth and teeth.

**20. Film Producer:**

Looking at the film industry and how films are produced.

**21. Make Up Artist:**

Fancy a hands on career? Do you enjoy creating a certain look? Then find out how to train as a make-up artist and where you can work.

**22. Setting Up Your Own Business?:**

Want to be your own boss and eventually run your own business? What are the skills you need? What are the benefits of working for your self and yes, what are the pitfalls! If you are interested in discussing the above and want to contribute, then come along and join us.

**23. Creative Director - Advertising:**

The Creative Director of an advertising company is responsible for a team of people who produce advertising for a group of clients. This will involve brainstorming an idea and working closely with the team that create the artwork for campaigns.

**24. Mining and Geology:**

Specialist in mining and mineral exploration. Mine geologists provide advice and expertise on the geological aspects of development and

production in mine, pit and quarry sites. In overseeing drilling and surface exploration programmes, they help to determine likely directions for future development.

**25. Investment Banking:**

The main role of an investment banker is to advise companies and institutions on how they can achieve their goals and implement their plans. This includes helping them to raise funds.

**26. Social Worker and Special Educational Needs:**

Looking at social work careers including general social work, child care and Adoption and Fostering. Also looking at working with SEN students in an educational setting with an emphasis on Dyslexia.

**27. Insurance Underwriter:**

An insurer will look at all the circumstances surrounding a 'risk' before deciding whether or not to provide insurance cover against it, and this whole process is called 'underwriting'. Underwriters are the specialists employed by the insurer to carry out this task and they will want to understand a number of things about the risk such as how likely is it to happen, what steps are already taken to reduce the risk and what are the financial consequences of it happening.

**28. Geology/Oil Industry Careers:**

Looking at the variety of roles within the field of geology with an emphasis on the oil industry.

**29. Gap Force:**

Specialists in school and university gap year and overseas volunteering, filling the gap between your education and experience.

**30. Study in the USA:**

Looking at the process of US university applications and the cost involved.

**31. Love Cricket? What careers can you get involved in?**

Come and hear about the possibilities and opportunities open to you in the cricketing world.

**32. Pharmacist:**

A career in the drugs and medicines profession.

**33. Nursing – Adult:**

Adult nurses provide medical care, support the recovery of and promote good health amongst patients suffering from acute and long-term illnesses, diseases like diabetes or arthritis, or those requiring surgery. Nurses plan and carry out care within a multidisciplinary team but are the main point of contact for patients.

**34. Accountant:**

Chartered accountants work in many areas of business and the public sector, in roles ranging from sole practitioner to chief executive of a multinational company. They can provide professional services to a wide range of fee paying clients from private individuals to large commercial and public sector organisations, including banks. These services include audit/assurance, accountancy, tax, business advisory, management consultancy, systems and IT, corporate finance, corporate recovery and forensic accounting. In commerce/industry and the public sector, they work in a variety of roles including fund management, venture capital and equity analysis, as well as financial management and financial reporting roles.

**35. Commercial Pilot:**

Flying commercial aircraft carrying passengers and/or freight

**36. Newspaper Journalist:**

Reporting current news events for national newspaper.

**37. Scientist – Research:**

Working in Leukaemia Research at one of the world's most prestigious research universities.

**38. Sales Director:**

Responsible for maximising the sales of products and services of a well-known sports car organisation. This career is all about driving a sales performance, communications and people management.

**39. Property Developer and Quantity Surveying:**

Someone involved in all aspects of building, construction and renovation of buildings. This can include the buying and selling of land and property.

**40. Interior Designer:**

Interior designers are involved in the renovation and restructuring of an internal space, including structural alterations, in addition to the design of the eventual colour scheme, furniture and furnishings. They produce designs for businesses, hotels and domestic properties, overseeing projects from the outset through to completion

**41. Barrister:**

Someone who represents people, through their solicitor, in courts of law.

**42. Events Management:**

Someone responsible for the organisation of specialised events at various locations. This can include accommodation, travel, specialist services and much more.

**43. Careers in Science:**

Dr Rebecca Bowden has a first degree in Microbial Biotechnology and a PhD in Molecular Biology, her field of research was in the design and risk assessment of genetically modified micro-organisms. She has worked for

the UK government on GM foods, environmental issues, Science in the Media and in counterterrorism, and also for the Royal Society on science policy. She is passionate about engaging young people in science and technology and encouraging them to take up careers in these fields. She is the CEO of an educational charity (Surrey SATRO) which works to raise aspirations in young people and help them to realize their potential.

**44. Management Consultant:**

Management consultants are primarily concerned with initiating and implementing technological, organisational and behavioural changes. Their work involves providing objective appraisals where it is often easier for an expert outsider to see the broader picture and reorganise the long-term requirements of an organisation.

**45. Insurance Broker:**

Insurance brokers apply their knowledge of insurance products to identify and arrange appropriate insurance cover for individuals and companies. Working as intermediaries between the client and the insurance company, brokers assess clients' risks accurately and then find and recommend appropriate policies.

**46. Theatre Costume Designer and Careers in the Fashion Industry:**

A costume designer is responsible for the design, creation and purchase of costumes and accessories worn in television, film and stage productions.

**47. Life and Business Coach:**

This role is very customer focussed whether working with individuals on a one to one basis or designing tailor made training and development sessions for a variety of organisations. What does becoming a life coach entail and what are the qualifications needed to get there?

**48. Police Officer:**

Some one who works with the community, organisation and authorities to uphold the law within a certain area. There are many areas of specialist areas once trained.

**49. Human Resources/Personnel:**

The HR department develops, advises on and implements policies relating to the effective use of people within an organisation. They can also be responsible for recruiting, training and monitoring staff.

**50. Graphic/Web Designer and Photography:**

A graphic designer produces visual solutions to meet the communication needs of clients. Designs are usually two-dimensional for advertising campaigns, book covers, magazines, posters, company logos, television graphics and websites. Some designers work on three-dimensional designs, in the form of product packaging, exhibitions and displays. Web designers are also known as web producers, internet engineers and multimedia architects. They are responsible for the design, layout and coding of web pages.

**51. Careers in Medical Science:**

Currently Director of Scientific Affairs at Pfizer Ltd, one of the world's leading pharmaceutical companies, Neil Davie has not reached his current role via the conventional route, attending university later than normal where he gained his PhD. This talk would suit anyone considering a scientific based degree or career in the future.

**52. Affected by Dyslexia?**

Hear from a leading pharmaceutical scientist how he has adapted his strategies to deal with his dyslexia in order to reach his goals.

**53. Vet:**

Veterinary surgeons aim to prevent disease and cure illness and injury in animals. They combine their knowledge of animal physiology, nutrition and medicine with practical surgical skills to diagnose and treat animals.

**54. Actor:**

An actor communicates a character and situations to an audience by using speech, body language and movement. Work varies enormously, from live stage performances of the classics and community theatre to soap operas, radio work and film parts. An actor's role may involve education, training or therapy as well as entertainment.

**55. GP/Doctor:**

General practitioners (GPs) provide primary and continuing medical care for patients, taking account of physical, psychological and social factors when diagnosing illness. They recommend the required treatment, or refer the patient to hospital clinics for further assessment and/or further treatment.

**56. TV Production:**

TV Production Manager, like a Project Manager, trying to keep the programme to budget and working with TV Producers/directors etc, to find practical ways of getting their creative ideas onto the screen. There are jobs for all personalities and all skills in TV - creative, logistics, sales, technical etc.

**57. Politics:**

Careers in the world of politics.

**58. Recruitment Consultant: Pharmaceuticals and Bio-Technology**

From a degree in Egyptian Archaeology to a medical recruitment consultant. This is a fast moving and productive career which requires first class communication and people facing skills. Come and find out what a recruitment consultant really does.

**59. Working in the Media:**

Working for one of the world's best known PR companies after completing a postgraduate Masters degree in Marketing. Covering media and broadcast related companies and careers, not just public relations and

communications, but also brand management, marketing strategy and management and E-marketing.

**60. Sport Coach:**

What's it like to be a sport coach.

**61. Computer Games Designer:**

How to get into this ever-changing world of computer games design.

**62. Forensic Scientist:**

Working for the Forensic Science Service and the Police, a Forensic Scientist examines the scientific evidence relating to a variety of crimes. This can include crime scene investigation as well as analysis of evidence within a laboratory environment. This role also involves attendance in court to give evidence.

**63. Pricewaterhouse Coopers:**

Looking at careers and Gap Year programmes with PwC, one of the world's largest professional service firms, providing people, companies and public bodies with the specialist expertise they need to help them plan and carry out their business and financial activities, as well as finding ways in which they can enhance the value of their organisation.

This organisation run paid training programmes for school leavers, gap student and university sponsorship placements.

**64. Loss Adjuster:**

Usually working as a consultant to an insurance company, a loss adjuster values a claim under an insurance policy, which in turn depends on the value of the item lost or damaged and suggesting the extent of the policy cover. The role includes evaluating damage to buildings and contents, and any loss of profits resulting, but loss adjusters also deal with claims under liability, engineering, construction and other specialist covers.

**65. Equity Broker:**

Careers trading in stocks and shares.

**66. Metals Broker:**

A metals broker is a **commodity broker** who specialises in the buying and selling of metals on behalf of clients.

**67. Physiotherapist:**

Physiotherapists treat a range of physical problems resulting from illness, injury, disability or ageing. These problems are treated with manual therapy, movement, exercise and the application of technological equipment, e.g. ultrasound.

Physiotherapists treat people of all ages and assist the rehabilitation process by developing and restoring the function of the body, enabling patients to improve their mobility. They will also offer advice on how to prevent further physical damage.

**68. Cameraman:**

Looking at careers as a freelance cameraman.

**69. Creative Roles in Advertising:**

Talk about the role of creative jobs within advertising and Direct Marketing – Art Directing, Copywriting, Design, Web and Film.

**70. Marine Biologist:**

Marine biologists study the plants and animals that live in the world's oceans. They look at the way these creatures and organisms interact with the environment and with each other. They also measure the effects of human activities and environmental changes.

**71. Careers Using Art:**

A top School of Art will be talking about the degrees they offer and the art based careers that their graduates move into.

**72. IT Management Consultant:**

Working within a large organisation, running a large team of staff, maintaining all IT equipment. This includes computers and telecommunications plus much more.

**73. Software Engineer/Analyst:**

One of the top three jobs in IT in terms of the numbers employed, a software engineer designs, tests, implements and maintains software systems to meet client or employer needs

**74. Hotel Management:**

Running a large hotel and its entire staff. What does this career involve?

**75. Dietician:**

Registered dieticians are uniquely qualified to translate scientific information about food into practical dietary advice for those on both normal and therapeutic diets. As well as providing impartial advice about nutrition and health and promoting a healthy well-balanced diet, dieticians also offer advice on food-related problems and treat disease and ill health.

**76. Teacher:**

Looking at Primary roles.

**77. Archaeologist:**

Apart from digging, archaeologists preserve record and interpret archaeological remains and may get involved in education, publicity and conservation. Interpretation and dissemination is as important as excavation and may take up much of the archaeologist's time. Archaeology is the study of material remains and the environmental effects of human behaviour from all periods of history. Sites of interest can range from buried cities to microscopic marine organisms.

**78. Working in Television Production (Including Sound Engineering):**

A Talk about all aspects of television production; in other words what it takes to get a television programme on the screen. Ideally this should attract students interested in creative writing, drama, social and current affairs, photography, filmmaking, design and art, broadcast technology and production management.

**79. HM Diplomatic Service:**

Looking at the variety of careers available.

**80. Foreign and Commonwealth Office: UK Climate Envoy**

**81. Civil Engineer:**

Civil engineers are involved with the design, development and construction of a huge range of projects in the built and natural environment.

**82. A Career in Marketing:**

How do you market organisations' services? What does a career in marketing really involve?

**83. Careers in the Maritime Industry**

Including Yacht Training, Engineering and much more.

**84. Textile Design:**

The courses available and what are the career paths available.

**85. Gap Year in South Africa:**

Shumba Experience has conservation projects throughout Southern Africa, where you have the chance to work as a conservation volunteer on game reserves, veterinary projects and wildlife research projects. As volunteers you'll be working directly with conservation professionals on location in South Africa, Botswana or Namibia. Conservation and marine projects vary in length from between 7 days to 12 weeks, and it is possible to combine two or more projects into one longer experience.

**86. Careers in the Army:**

**87. Corporate Finance and Fund Management:**

Corporate finance is an area of finance dealing with financial decisions business enterprises make and the tools and analysis used to make these decisions. Fund management involves investing cash of financial institutions (such as pension funds) and private investors in various assets including shares and other investments.

**88. Studying Mechanical Engineering at University:**

Where can this degree subject lead you and what does it involve? Do you love maths and physics and enjoy creating moving things? Then come and listen to this talk to find out more!

**89. What is Mechanical Engineering?**

Come and find out what this career really involves.

**90. Media and Entertainment – TV Industry:**

Former CEO of Channel 4 talks about careers in the media and entertainment industry within Channel 4 and the BBC. He will also cover his wider roles and experiences through the Media Trust and the Royal Television Society's Future group.

**91. Stockbroker:**

High profile career dealing in stocks and shares.

**92. Medical School – A Day in the Life of a Med School Student:**

Two ex-pupils currently studying post graduate medicine at UCL talk candidly about everyday life and the pressures of studying medicine. Both students have entered med school through bioscience degrees.

**93. Careers in the RAF:****94. Studying at University in Australia and New Zealand**

Hear about all the options and the cost of studying at a university in Australia or New Zealand plus info about how to apply and what you can study.

**95. Museum Curator:**

Responsible for the day to day running of a museum

**96. Stage, Event and Concert Touring - Technical Production:**

Looking at the technical careers surrounding this industry as well as starting a business and identifying and developing an entrepreneurial opportunity.

**97. Management Consultancy and Psychology:**

Adrienne is a director of a management consultancy called Foresight Partnership which she co-founded in 2004. She specialises in supporting boards and senior teams in public services to become more effective in their governance roles. Adrienne has held a number of public and voluntary appointments. She is currently Vice Chair of a large charity, the Health Foundation. She was Deputy Chair of the Audit Commission until end October 2003, and was acting chair of the Commission for a year before that. Adrienne was also a director of the Accountancy Foundation. She chaired Croydon Health Authority for eight years until March 2000. Adrienne's previous experience is in human resources management at director level for Citicorp in Europe and in the US, and as a consultant specialising in change management and coaching in the private sector. She has an MA in Experimental Psychology from Oxford University and an MSc in Occupational Psychology from Birkbeck College, London. She is a member of the Chartered Institute of Personnel Development, and the British Psychological Society and is a Fellow of the Royal Society of the Arts. Adrienne was awarded the CBE in the 2003 Queen's birthday honours.

**98. Newspaper Editor:**

Newspaper Editors are responsible for the style and content of their publications. The role of the Editor is likely to involve managing staff as well as having a legal and moral responsibility for the paper's content.

**99. Allied Health Professions:**

Looking at careers and degrees available in the health service including radiography, speech and language therapy and nursing.

**100. Gap Years – Think Pacific:**

A small niche market gap year organisation offering fantastic experiences on the island of Fiji. Projects to get involved in include, sport coaching, construction, art, drama, music and a whole lot more.

**101. Deloitte:**

As one of the UK's fastest growing major professional services firm the Deloitte Scholars Scheme provides a unique opportunity to combine your dream of travelling during your gap year with invaluable paid business experience at Deloitte.

**102. Camp America:**
