Artist Carolyn Genders Runs a Workshop for Lower Sixth Art Students

On Monday 8th February 2010, Lower Sixth art students spent an action packed day working in the art studios with artist Carolyn Genders. The artist showed the students some of her work and demonstrated her working process.

Carolyn creates hand built sculptural vessels, working spontaneously, creating forms and surfaces that evoke the feeling she has when in the landscape, not illustrating it but striving to convey nuance of shape, balance and mass and creating mood and atmosphere. Students were taken through a range of activities from drawing with ink on long sticks, through monoprinting and finally into clay with coloured slips.

Marilyn Kyle said: "Carolyn has a distinctive artistic voice and her work is to be found in many public and private collections. The students left at the end of the day with a large amount of work which they can use as part of their research for their current externally set project."

Carolyn was born in Singapore. She has a BA (Hons) degree from Brighton and a Postgraduate Diploma in Ceramics from Goldsmiths College. Carolyn has published two books: 'Sources of Inspiration' which has been reprinted several times and 'Pattern, Colour and Form' published in 2009.
