Physics at Caterham

The Physics Department at Caterham is one of the most active and successful departments in the School with well qualified and enthusiastic staff who bring their own exciting styles and charisma to their teaching. Our students genuinely enjoy their study and have an admirable thirst for knowledge. The Department has been awarded 6 Good Schools Guides Awards since 2010, and consistently is one of the best departments in the school in terms of value-added to student performance. Despite this level of success we are convinced we can do still better. We are looking for someone with a passion for Physics to share our vision and practice of dynamic teaching and learning and to further enhance our success. It is a testament to the success and productive environment within the department that over the past four years that all four junior teachers who have moved on to other UK schools have moved to Head of Physics positions at top independent schools.

All members of the department are encouraged to use the flexibility of our syllabus and approach to pursue their own passions and interests within the subject, from Junior Science through to IGCSE and A-Level. We aim to encourage an atmosphere of enthusiasm for the subject and debate about it, both amongst ourselves and with students.

In the First Year pupils are taught Science by one teacher for 5 periods a week. Physics is taught by specialist teachers to all students from the Second Year. In the First and Second Year pupils follow an

in-house programme that addresses key concepts and gives them as much hands-on practical experience as possible while embedding an understanding of scientific method.

We follow the Edexcel IGCSE specification from the start of the Third Year. All pupils follow the Triple Award Course until the end of the Fourth Year, when some pupils may opt for Double Award in the Fifth Year. The vast majority of students opt to take the Triple Award, with almost all achieving an A or A*. At A-Level we follow the well-regarded OCR Physics A syllabus. The number of A-Level students is increasing every year with over 60 starting the course and 52 committing to the 2 year linear A-level. Over the past few years we have prepared students excellently to move on to study Physics, Engineering or related courses at top universities, with 16 achieving offers at Oxford and Cambridge over the past four years.

Physics at Caterham

For lower years our teaching programme is augmented by Science trips to places such as the Science Museum, Marwell Zoo and the Science Centre at Herstmonceux. In this way, all students are encouraged to engage in the subject in an active way. The student run Physical Sciences Society also regularly advertises and sources tickets for evening lectures in London.

The breadth of activity outside of the classroom is one of the most enjoyable aspects of the department, from an astronomy club which organises observations and events periodically through the year, to in-house electronics, aeronautics, rocketry, 'lego mindstorms' and practical problem solving clubs. Students and staff put on a series of challenging and stimulating lectures throughout the year. Attendance at these activities is high, with 60 or more pupils attending lectures. We have also recently hosted a symposium for local schools on Stellar Astrophysics and Nuclear Fusion to mark the solar eclipse. We run sessions to enable the most motivated students to stretch their knowledge beyond the syllabus, teaching Astronomy GCSE as a single year afterschool course in the 4th year, and running courses on bridge design and special relativity for the Lower 6th.

The department is popular place for students and one in which staff and students alike enjoy spending time. It is well settled within the newest buildings on the school site providing us with 5 generously proportioned and fully equipped laboratories, one for each teacher and used only for Physics, a store room and a spacious prep room.

The department currently consists of five full-time and one part-time member of staff plus one full-time technician.



The Role

We are seeking a teacher to:

- Teach Physics from Second Year to Upper Sixth level
- Teach Science at First Year level as required
- Plan stimulating and informative lessons, in line with the departmental schemes of work
- Mark student work and tests regularly in line with departmental policy
- Contribute to oral and written assessment, reports and references for pupils
- Lead Physics help sessions as part of a departmental rota one lunchtime per week
- Educate the student body more broadly, drawing on specialist skills, knowledge and experience; for example by giving occasional lectures, running a physics related club or assisting with Oxbridge preparation
- Undertake and check demonstrations and class experiments before using them in lessons
- Participate in relevant meetings and INSET
- Develop and improve one's own skills and knowledge, within the School's performance management process by engaging in lesson observations, seeking pupil feedback, and evaluating performance together with respective line managers in academic, pastoral and co-curricular areas.

Undertake other tasks as reasonably required by the School

The ideal candidate will:

- Possess a relevant degree, preferably in Physics
- or Engineering from a top university
- Be an excellent communicator of physics
- Have excellent subject knowledge and a passion for their specialist area
- Be well organised with a track record of high achievement
- Have a genuine interest in children's education and be passionate about guiding them to success
- Be a reflective practitioner with a desire to improve
- Have some teaching or tutoring experience

This post would suit someone new to the profession or an experienced teacher. OTS is not essential as we offer an in-house

training programme which can lead to QTS.

The person appointed will be expected to play a full and positive part in the life of the School. Therefore, the ability, and a willingness to become involved in, and contribute to other co-curricular activities will be essential.

CATERHAM'S TEEN TECH NATIONAL WIN!

Caterham School's Teen Tech team have been announced as national winners at a special ceremony at Buckingham Palace. The three-strong team were chosen as overall national winners for their design and prototype of 'SensoSafe' – a bike light that also detects vehicles approaching the cyclist from behind, alerting them to the potential danger. The young engineers were presented their award by HRH the Duke of York.

Teen Tech is a national competition that invites entries from across the UK in a multitude of different STEM disciplines. The event recorded its highest ever number of entries this year with an astonishing 1400 groups putting forward their innovative ideas.
