University of Nottingham - Veterinary Medicine News

The School of Veterinary Medicine and Science at the University of Nottingham have written with some useful information about both their courses and across the country in general, and I have outlined some of the more interesting points below:

In 2019 there were only 1,900 UK applicants for 1,000 Veterinary School places.

Nottingham do not consider predicted grades when they make offers. They are looking for well-rounded candidates who have personal and practical skill, animal orientation, enthusiasm and potential.

They have two intakes – 150 places in September and another 150 places in April.

They have a small number of places available in adjustment and clearing each year.

They offer a 6 year course for students who do not have the required science A levels.

Formed in 2004 and based in St Andrews, The R&A engages in and supports activities undertaken for the benefit of the sport of golf. They offer a number of golf scholarships to students applying to certain universities in the UK and abroad (not USA). Click here to find out more.
