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#### Introduction

Below shows the breakdown of the different components and their weightings in relation to the overall A Level marks.



**Component I: Performing**

### **Component 2: Composition**

You will produce a **mini-portfolio** which will include **three** very short compositions. Each composition will have a focus, within which you should try to show off your knowledge and be as creative as you can. We are **not** looking for a finished composition, but **potential musical ideas**.


